Dear Church Family,

As I sit here thinking about the last year, I find myself wondering why

things happened as they did, or more importantly, I wonder what this next

year will bring.

As a pastor who does a bit of counseling, I've witnessed evidence

that if we don't make good choices about the direction of our lives, we will

find ourselves being directed by the choices that others make for us. And

of course, that leaves us dealing with the consequences; often to our

chagrin.

Out of embarrassment, we blame our spouses, our parents, our

bosses, the economy, the world situation, Elvis, or whatever person or

phenomenon we have encountered for our dilemma. But it doesn't really

help and nothing ever changes.

So... what's wrong in your life? What's missing? What mistakes have you made that need fixing? What is left undone? As you ask these questions, notice how easy it is to blame others for the holes in our lives.

What do we do? Well, many people turn to various addictions, i.e. drugs, alcohol, food or other means of escape.

But is that the solution? Just mellow out? Take something to push the pain or discomfort away? Blame is a good mellowing agent, whether it's directed at others or ourselves. It diffuses the issues enough that we are soon mellowed into an uncomfortable inactive state.

People of faith however have other options. Look realistically at your life, don't just accept the view that others put on you, and get rid of what you know to be sin in your lives. (see James 1:22-26) Accept the forgiveness that is offered you in Christ. This releases us from being controlled by guilt and self-blame. Ask God for guidance and power to live out your faith and begin to move out in new or better directions. Cut the strings, break the chains that influence your life and you'll find joy and peace

in Christ.

May the Lord help us all to make better decisions in the coming year and help us to be a reflection of Jesus to our own sphere of influence.

Dear Friends:

It's the time of year when we all tend to look at our many blessings and consider all the things for which we are thankful. We remind our children at home how blessed they are, and we even share messages on Facebook about being thankful. The children here at the Florida United Methodist Children's Home have much to be thankful for because of your support. In many cases, they are simply thankful to be out of the traumatic environment from which they had to be removed. Nicole was one of those children who had to be removed from her home, and has flourished here at the Children's Home.

Nicole grew up in an abusive environment. When she was only eleven years old, she watched her mother die from a drug overdose. Her stepfather soon followed the path of Nicole's mother and became addicted to drugs as well and the abuse continued. After a couple of years, her biological father came back into the picture. He assumed custody of Nicole and her siblings, but things didn't really improve.

Nicole struggled in school with very low grades and she was academically behind due to years of familial dysfunction. Prior to coming here, she had never even been to church. But that has all changed since Nicole came to the Children's Home. Academically, she is on track and her grades have improved. She has become one of our more dedicated students and is taking an active role in the Chapel services here on campus. Next summer, she will graduate from our oncampus school, Legacy Scholars Academy, and then attend a local college to become an RN.

Nicole's success did take time, and it required specialized therapy and support. But it was made possible entirely through the support of friends like you. Your support not only provides for the skilled counseling and mentoring for our children, but also for the food, clothing, education and other necessities for a happy and healthy life. And it can even help children like Nicole write the next chapter in her life as she prepares for college.

We are very appreciative of your congregation's recent gift of \$610.00. Your generosity is making an impact in the lives of our children.


