## FROM THE PASTOR

#### BEING THANKFUL DURING THANKSGIVING

11-17-20

Even though we don't observe Thanksgiving as a holy day or a religious holiday, it is a time when most Americans are thankful for the blessings they have received, and I believe expressions of gratitude are proper and appropriate. However instead of expressing our gratitude just one day each year, it seems to me that we should express our thanks every day. I mean, we receive blessings on a daily basis don't we, so we should be thankful on a daily basis.

In the model prayer that we recite each Sunday from the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 6:11, Jesus taught us to pray to God so that He might, "Give us this day our daily bread." In 1 Timothy 4:3 we hear that God created foods which are "to be received with thanksgiving." Verse four continues the thought by saying, "For every creature of God is good, and nothing is to be refused if it is received with thanksgiving." (Bacon makes everything better!)

Our thanksgiving should be offered up to God for the blessings we have because <u>He is the source of all good</u> <u>things</u>. "Every good gift and every perfect gift are from above, and comes down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow of turning" (James 1:17). Many of the people who will be thankful on Thanksgiving Day, will regard it as good fortune or good planning and they'll fail to be thankful to God simply because "all things" we receive are from God, and we should thank Him for all things; All the physical blessings and privileges we enjoy.

You may remember a time when Jesus cleansed ten lepers, but only one of them thanked Him for it. Jesus asked, "Were there not ten cleansed? But where are the nine? Were there not any found who returned to give glory to God except this foreigner?" (Luke 17:17-18). Those who receive blessings from God, must be thankful to Him. Christians ought to be even more expressive and passionate in their expressions of thanksgiving to God because not only are they blessed with those material blessings that sustain physical life but they also receive all spiritual blessings in Christ (Eph. 1:3) which sustain them spiritually and enable them to overcome sin and death in order to live eternally.

Those spiritual blessings are the most precious and if you are not receiving them, you should know that they're available to you, if you'll submit to Jesus Christ for the salvation of your soul. You see, there is no better way to show gratitude to God for that which He has graciously given to us than by living in submission to His will, loving, acknowledging, and thanking Him as obedient children. Thanksgiving Day, and every day, let us give thanks to God.

May all good things be yours according to God's grace and mercy and may you have a very happy Thanksgiving.

# Pumpkin Patch Update

The Pumpkin Patch at Trinity closed October 31, 2020 after our most unusual and best year ever. We did not receive the pumpkins until October 19, 2020. We did not have any Storytime on Wednesday and no Fall Festival and no school classes on weekdays. We did have our best sales year since we started selling pumpkins in 1999. Customers were glad to see we were open, they were friendly, they followed the social distancing requirements, and they blessed our fundraiser with generous purchases and donations. We collected \$3,112.35 in donations and our percentage of the pumpkin sales. That was a blessing for not only our church but for the Pumpkin Patch USA company who provides the orange friends to us each year. Farmer Bob tended his crop daily, volunteers assisted, and Mrs. Pumpkin came by to visit and socialize with her orange friends. Below is a letter from the owner of Pumpkin Patch USA which he sent to all customers who received pumpkins this year.

Dear Partners, At the beginning of the shipping season it seemed that we would never be able to repay the line of credit we used for the 2020 Pumpkin growing season. So many of our partners passed on doing a patch in 2020 due to the virus. A combination of a pumpkin shortage in most parts of the country and you, the remaining group of dedicated and patient partners, produced record sales at your individual locations. Many of you have experienced a significant increase in sales. We know some of your organizations are also struggling, we hope this helps. So many small businesses, like ourselves, are in trouble. Some are even losing their businesses that took a lifetime to build. This has been a difficult year for all of us, we are extremely grateful to have survived. Please share this story and my Thanks to all Coordinators and volunteers. Thanks, Richard Hamby Thanks to all who helped unload the pumpkins. Thanks to all who sat with the pumpkins and welcomed people to Trinity each day. Thanks to all who provided snacks and food for the workers. Thanks to all who lifted the fundraiser up in prayer.
