From the Pastor

Even though we don't observe Thanksgiving as a holy day or a religious holiday, it is a time when most Americans are thankful for the blessings they have received, and I believe expressions of gratitude are proper and appropriate.

However instead of expressing our gratitude just one day each year, I believe we should express our thanks every day. I mean, we receive blessings daily, don't we? And therefor we should be thankful daily.

In the model prayer of the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 6:11, Jesus taught us to pray to god so that He might, "Give us this day our daily bread."

In 1st Timothy 4:3 we hear that God created foods which are "to be received with thanksgiving." Verse four continues the thought be saying, "For every creature of God is good, and nothing is to be refused if it is received with thanksgiving."

Our thanksgiving should be offered up to God for the blessings we have because <u>He is the source of all good things</u>. Every good gift and every perfect gift are from above, and comes down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow of turning" (James 1:17).

You may remember a time when Jesus cleansed ten lepers, but only one of them thanked Him for it. Jesus asked, *Were there not ten cleansed? But where are the nine? Were there not any found who returned to give glory to God except this foreigner?*" (Luke 17:17-18). Those who receive blessings from God, must be thankful to Him.

Christians ought to be even more expressive and fervent in their expressions of thanksgiving to God because not only are they blessed with those material blessings that sustain physical life, but they also receive <u>all spiritual blessings</u> in Christ (Eph. 1:3) which sustain them spiritually and enable them to overcome sin and death in order to live eternally.

Those spiritual blessings are the most precious and if you are not receiving them, you should know that they are available to you, if you will submit to the gospel for the salvation of your soul.

You see, there is no better way to show gratitude to God for that which He has graciously given to us than by living in submission to His will, loving, acknowledging, and thanking Him as obedient children. Thanksgiving Day, and every day, let us give thanks to God.

May all good things be yours according to God's grace and mercy and may you have a very happy Thanksgiving.

Recipes



30 Minute Shepherd's Pie

Recipe submitted by CJ Walter

It's easy comfort food.

30-minute Shepherd's Pie

Cook Time: 25 minutes

Level: Easy Yield: 4 servings

Ingredients:

2 pounds potatoes, such as russet, peeled and cubed

2 tablespoons sour cream or softened cream cheese

1 large egg yolk

1/2 cup cream, for a lighter version substitute vegetable or chicken broth

Salt and freshly ground black pepper

1 tablespoon extra-virgin olive oil, 1 turn of the pan

1 3/4 pounds ground beef or ground lamb

1 carrot, peeled and chopped

1 onion, chopped

2 tablespoons butter

2 tablespoons all-purpose flour

1 cup beef stock or broth

2 teaspoons Worcestershire, eyeball it

1/2 cup frozen peas, a couple of handfuls

1 teaspoon sweet paprika

2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley leaves

Directions:

Boil potatoes in salted water until tender, about 12 minutes. Drain potatoes and pour them into a bowl. Combine sour cream, egg yolk and cream. Add the cream mixture into potatoes and mash until potatoes are almost smooth.

While potatoes boil, preheat a large skillet over medium high heat. Add oil to hot pan with beef or lamb. Season meat with salt and pepper. Brown and crumble meat for 3 or 4 minutes. If you are using lamb and the pan is fatty, spoon away some of the drippings. Add chopped carrot and onion to the meat. Cook veggies with meat 5 minutes, stirring frequently. In a second small skillet over medium heat cook butter and flour together 2 minutes. Whisk in broth and Worcestershire sauce. Thicken gravy 1 minute. Add gravy to meat and vegetables. Stir in peas. Preheat broiler to high. Fill a small rectangular casserole with meat and vegetable mixture. Spoon potatoes over meat evenly. Top potatoes with paprika and broil 6 to 8 inches from the heat until potatoes are evenly browned. Top casserole dish with chopped parsley and serve.
