Through our therapeutic program, he has resolved the anger issues, and he has even earned his learner's permit from the DMV. When I asked him recently what he was most proud of, he replied, "I've matured a lot. Now I get to be a role model to the other kids, and help them like I've been helped."

Most of our children here at the Children's Home come from situations of abuse, abandonment, or neglect. We strive to make sure that our children are not only filled with the joys of the season, but also understand the true meaning as well – the message of Jesus Christ.

It is because of friends like you that we are able to provide the loving home longed for by our children and the extra special memories during this holiday season. And there's nothing more important to remember than the Christmas message as conveyed in Luke 2: 14, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men."

We are very appreciative of your congregation's recent gift of \$710.00. Your generosity is making an impact in the lives of our children.
